## Language Skills

### Let's Play!

For preschoolers who have language challenges  
Using songs, books, and games, Let's Play! teaches language concepts like prepositions (under, behind, etc.), opposites, following directions, and more.

### Bookworms

For preschoolers who have language challenges  
Each week will revolve around a themed book, with related singing, acting, and craft activities. Bookworms is designed to increase early language, story comprehension, sequencing, and vocabulary.

### Hot Topics

For students ages 9-14 working on reading comprehension/language skills (grouped by age)  
Participants will read and discuss high interest / current news articles to focus on comprehension, expression, written language, vocabulary, critical thinking, and more.

## Articulation

### Speech Masters

For elementary-aged children working on articulation  
This group's aim is to develop mastery of sound targets. Carry-over of sounds is promoted by practicing them in sentences and in conversation.

## Phonology | Apraxia

### Motor Mouths

For children ages 3-5 with apraxia or delays in speech sound development  
A specific sound will be targeted each week using books, games, songs, circle activities, and snacks.

## Social Skills | Fine Motor Focus

### CTS Lego® Club

For Lego® enthusiasts with autism or related social and fine motor challenges  
Children are grouped by age and use Lego® projects to promote fine motor skills, as well as sharing, turn-taking, self-regulation, and problem solving. This group is led by an Occupational Therapist.



## Social Thinking | Social Skills

### Let's Talk 1

For children ages 4-8 who are working on social skills  
Through group games and role-playing, children will enhance conversational turn-taking abilities, initiating and maintaining appropriate conversation, and taking others' perspectives.

### Movie Night for the STARS

**STARS: Social Thinking And Relationship Success**  
For students ages 4-10 who are working on social skills (grouped by age)

A movie is shown in each session to provide a variety of social situations to discuss, take different perspectives, and make predictions.

### Let's Talk 2

For middle school students working on social skills  
Through role-play and peer modeling, students will learn how to enter a conversation, change a topic, interrupt appropriately, and more!

For Lego® enthusiasts with autism or related social and communication challenges  
Children are grouped by age and use Lego® projects to develop skills in self-regulation, problem solving, conversation skills, sharing, turn-taking, and collaboration.



## Fluency | Stuttering

### Smooth Speech Adventures

For students ages 6-8 who stutter  
Through various fun adventure activities, participants will learn more about the components of stuttering, develop awareness of "smooth" vs. "bumpy" speech, and acquire fluency strategies they can use.

## Feeding Challenges

### Feeding Fun

For preschoolers with problematic feeding behaviors  
The focus in this group is on increasing a child's comfort level with textures, tastes, smells, and consistencies of foods. The Sequential Oral Sensory feeding approach will be used. This group is led by an SLP and an OT.
